Outcome: The children will develop their geographical knowledge and will use this within a non-fiction piece of writing about infamous pirates!

Hook: Pirate themed dress up day and stories by Jonny Duddle

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As Readers, we will:

- continue to apply phonic knowledge and skills as the route to decode words until automatic decoding has become embedded and reading is fluent
- read accurately by blending the sounds in words that contain the graphemes taught so far, especially recognising alternative sounds for graphemes
- read accurately words of two or more syllables
- read aloud books closely matched to their improving phonic knowledge, sounding out many unfamiliar words
 accurately, automatically and without undue hesitation

As Writers, we will:

- begin to use expanded noun phrases to describe
- demarcate sentences with capital letters and full stops
- segment spoken words into phonemes and represent these by graphemes, spelling some words correctly and making phonically plausible attempts at others
- spell some common exception words
- form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place form lower-case letters of the correct size relative to one another in some of their writing use spacing between words
- to use a range of coordinating conjunctions (and, but, so) to join simple sentences together

As Mathematicians, we will:

- calculate within 20
