Our Journey....



SOLENT INFANT SCHOOL

In Reception we have been reading the book 'The Rainbow Fish' by Marcus Pfister. We have been thinking about how to be a kind friend and the importance of sharing. We each made a scale for our class Rainbow Fish. Each scale is different, unique and special to us. When

we made our scales, we talked about why our scale was special and why we decorated it the way we did. We thought about what makes us unique and special.



Year 1 have been learning about measurement! We have looked at length, mass and capacity. All the children have been learning through lots of practical activities, such filling containers with cubes to see how many they hold and using scales to see which objects are heavier/lighter. We have received some fantastic home learning work related to this.



In Year 2, the children have been learning all about different animals and their habitats. They have written animal fact files, animal riddles and also created some amazing animal habitats. The children spent time designing, labelling and identifying the resources that they would need to make their habitat 3D. As you can see, this careful thought process has enabled them to produce some truly unique projects.

This has definitely been a term of two parts! After Christmas, the children adapted to remote learning from home or being at school in "bubbles", with different adults supervising them throughout the week then, more recently, we welcomed everyone back in again and, once more, had our corridors and classrooms buzzing with excited voices! We are very proud of the children and their families and we are looking forward to a more settled Summer Term.

Since being back together, we have celebrated British Science Week and, as this was such a success, we have planned a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths) Week for after the Easter Holidays when we will be "Engineering Fairy Tales". Look out for more information!

The month of March has seen us focus on our Solent Schools' Value of Teamwork. We have enjoyed celebrating our achievements in our Friday assemblies in our class teams within our schools' team. We're proud to be Team Solent!
