draw inspiration from the outdoors and make links between learning outside and the positive benefits to our mental health. There will also be whole-school home learning for all of the Infants to get involved with.



Editing Experts!

This week, Year 3 have been working incredibly hard on their Non-Fiction Texts about... ANIMALS! Our perfect pupils have used their super skills to begin their editing process. Over the last few weeks, we have been exploring the genre of 'Explanation Texts' within our English and Guided Reading lessons. The children have learnt how to structure an explanation text, including: a title, subtitles, an introduction, main body and conclusion. As well as this, the children have also learnt a range of language features, including: the use of causal conjunctions, time conjunctions, adverbs and expanded noun phrases. Last week, the children produced their extended pieces of writing, and we were thrilled that they were able to apply everything they have learnt, to their independent, big writes. Well done, Year 4!

Year 5

This week in Year 5 we have been focusing on describing the setting of Pandora, which features in the film Avatar. The children have been using figurative language in their writing to describe their five senses. As well as implying their characters feelings throughout their use of vocabulary and action.

Recently, Year 6 have been studying Mayan culture as part of their ongoing topic work. In particular, they have been looking at Mayan sculpture and hieroglyphics, which use lots of figurative, animal and spiritual themes. During the initial stage, they completed a series of illustrations in response to the Mayan artwork and incorporated elements of this into their design stages. They will be using these designs to inform their own pieces of sculptural work later on in the term.
