
Year 2

This week in Maths, as part of our statistics unit, we have been exploring how to interpret timetables. We revised how to tell the time using analogue clocks where pupils were able to move the hands on their own individual clocks. We've also practised writing digital time using the 12 hour clock with PM and AM but also using the 24 hour clock notation. Once we had developed our confidence with time, we answered a range of problems involving bus, train, T.V and school timetables. We learnt how to work out the duration of an event, as well as how to find out the start or finish time of an event.

Parent & Carer Voice

At Solent we pride ourselves in our warm, caring and cohesive community. We are very grateful and proud of the fantastic families, governors and staff that make up this community. As such, we know how important it is to hear everybody's voice, because we know that you care! Last week, we asked you to feedback about our latest round of parent and carer appointments via an online survey. Thank you very much to all those of you who responded. We will now use your responses to help shape our provision in the future so that it best meets the needs of our community.

The feedback has told us that

92% of respondents found it easy to book the appointment online.

One parent mentioned that it was difficult to book multiple appointments quickly enough which meant missing out on slots for one child. We will investigate further and see if there is a solution!

94% **could see and hear the class teacher clearly.** Those that couldn't found that the phone screen was too small or the issue was internet connection at the home end.

88% of appointments were on time.

41% would like online meetings in the future. 24% would like face to face meetings. 35% would like the option to choose each time. Given this response, as soon as our risk assessment allows, we will begin to offer a choice of face to face or virtual parent appointments. We will definitely be bringing back 'work share' sessions and 'drop in' as soon as possible!

We also gave parents the opportunity to share any further comments regarding the parent appointment process. We have chosen just a few of the comments to share with you below.

'It would be really useful to have the parent appointment dates in advance each to help with organising work'

'I think the virtual appointments are great. It's so easy to book online and takes up a lot less time trying to get to and from the appointment physically. Have found them very positive experiences so far'.
