Your Voice Matters-Covid Measures

In our newsletter last week, we asked you how you feel about the current Covid measures in place across our schools. We have received some really positive suggestions from parents and carers and are currently investigating implementing some of these ideas across our sites. The data collated so far has told us that:

- Solent Infant School. Do you think parents and carers should be asked to wear a face mask when on the infant school site?
 Yes 33%
 No 67%
- Solent Junior School. Do you think parents and carers should be asked to wear a face mask when on the junior school site?
 Yes 44%
 No56%
- Solent Infant School. Do you think it would be helpful to re-introduce a one way system on the infant school site?
 Yes 40% No 60%
- Solent Junior School. Do you think it would be helpful to re-introduce a one way system on the junior school site?
 Yes 56% No 44%
- Would you like to see the return of a staggered start and finish time to reduce congestion during these times?
 Yes 38% No 63%




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Year
