In our Art lessons this term, we have been exploring the technique known as pointillism where small, distinct dots are applied in patterns to create an image. The pupils have learnt to position dots close together in order to create a darker tone and further apart to create a lighter impression. The children explored the work of Georges Seurat and even had a go at emulating his painting 'A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte'. They are now in the process of creating their own space-inspired pointillism piece of artwork.

#### A few reminders:


