Early Years!

This week, Year R have been having lots of fun learning all about making number 5. We have used our guided and independent explorations to discover which smaller numbers make up 5—the number bonds to 5! Using the Numicon, our five frames and our part-part-whole models, we have shown a growing understanding of how 5 is made. Our teachers were very impressed that lots of us could record our findings in number sentences too! Well done, Year R.



Year 1

Year 1 have been working hard in Art to develop their clay skills. They have been rolling, pinching, pulling and squeezing the clay to make mice. This has linked nicely to our theme this half term 'The Lion Inside' (our key English text). The children have been using adjectives in their writing to describe the characters from the book and have challenged themselves to use more exciting words!

Year 2

The year has only just begun and we have learnt so much already! In Maths, we have learnt about statistics. We have also learnt about perspective where we wrote some fantastic pieces of writing after reading Mini Grey's unusual take on the 'The Princess and the Pea'. Through our topic 'Castles and Dragons', we have learnt about the people who worked in a castle and painted some castle representations in the style of Paul Klee. We think the paintings are excellent. We hope you agree!



With our current focus on the theme of Aspiration, we have been thinking about how we can challenge ourselves in our learning. Year R have been using their coding skills to move the Bee-Bots around the journey mats as part of their Explorers theme and Year 1 have been improving their clay modelling skills: rolling, pinching and sculpting the clay to make some lifelike rodents. Year 2 have taken their inspiration from The Princess and the Pea story showing how dialogue can be shown in speech bubbles and painting watercolour castles in the style of Paul Klee! **Mrs Curthoys Head of School.**

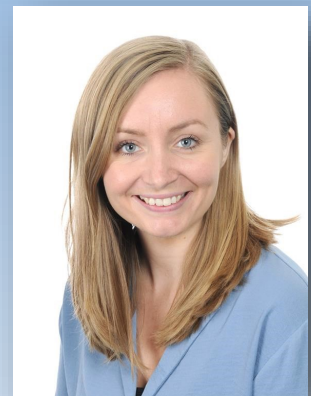
