## You Told Us & We Listened!

Last week, we invited you to take part in a uniform audit. We received a large number of responses and have collated these. They will now be taken, along with those from our pupils, to the next full Local Governing Body meeting on 15th February for further discussion. Below you will find a few data snips and extracts from the more popular parental and pupil responses.

Last term, we announced an exciting new development that is about to take place at Solent Junior School. The development of the original Victorian school hall into an exciting new shared learning space. We asked you and our pupils to vote on what you felt the space would be best suited for and would have the most positive impact upon our school community. We had a draw! Responses told us that there was a split view between a 'Research Hub' and IT Suite (modern library) and a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths space). 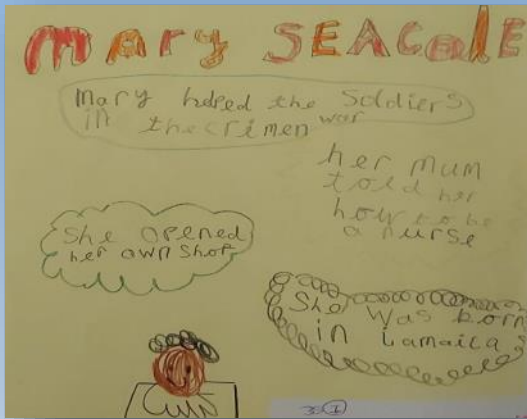
## Early Years!

## Year 1

As part of our History learning and linked to our learning theme about bravery, Year 1 have been finding out about the life and work of the famous nurse Mary Seacole and how she helped the soldiers during the Crimean War. The children made amazing posters using some of the facts they learned. Ask them what they know about Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale! In Maths they have been focusing on understanding Place Value using 2 digits numbers. They have been using practical resources to make and then pictorially record their work.



## Year 2

In Year 2 this week, we have celebrated Chinese New Year - the year of the tiger. Class 2M have been learning from their expert and are beginning to learn some Chinese words.

In Maths this week, we enjoyed pattern and shape learning and were challenged to say what shape would be 10th or 15th in the sequence when only part of the pattern was shown.

In Art, we have enjoyed drawing our 'dragon eyes' and improving our sketching and observational skills.







# SOLENT JUNIOR SCHOOL

In the month of February, we are revisiting the value of “friendship”. Each class has been considering the little things we can do, to show our friends we care. 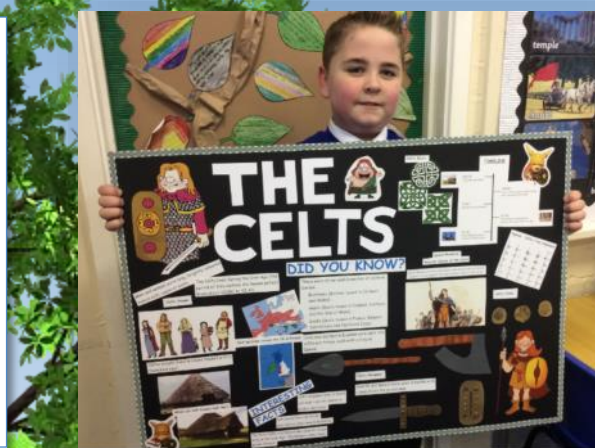
## Year 3

Year 3 are really enjoying learning more about glaciers in our Geography topic, Ice ice baby. We’ve used laptops to investigate glaciers and find out what they are. Then, we used atlases to explore our world and find out where glaciers were most likely to form. We learnt about the water cycle and how it’s really important for our planet to survive. We even gained some new topic vocabulary like evaporate, condensation, precipitation and water vapour which also ties in with our Science! Our recent detective work has come up with a fact sheet on how glaciers are formed and that they actually move!



## Year 4

This week, we have begun our new History topic, all about the Romans. To kick start this topic, the children produced a learning log piece of homework all about The Celts. As part of this topic so far, we have looked at chronology and timelines and have ordered key historical events from the Roman Era. We have also explored Roman and Celtic artefacts and have worked on developing our sketching skills, to create observation drawings. As the topic goes on, we will discover more about Roman Mosaics and will use potato printing to create our own!



## Year 5

This week in English, the children have been busy learning about Beowulf, an Anglo-Saxon poem which was turned into a book by Michael Morpurgo. Year 5 have been busy re-writing the battle scene between Beowulf and Grendel’s mother, the Sea Hag! The pupils have been spotting the key features in a setting description: fronted adverbials; adjectives; adverbs and expanded noun phrases. They have been coming up with some amazing sentences to describe the battle, using their knowledge of SNOT (show, not tell) to convey how each of the characters is feeling.





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## Year 6

Over the past few weeks, Year 6 have been learning something new as part of our 'Just 4 Fun' activities, and pupils can partake in an activity they may never considered and maybe even learn a new skill! The budding popstars in 6P have been learning to perform a rap from the song 'Enemy' by Imagine Dragons; 6W have been conjuring up their illusionist skills by learning magic tricks, and 6SW have been on a search for their inner zen, by learning the art of meditation.
