### Would You Like to Come Along on School Trips?

We have really missed being able to invite parents, carers and other family members into school, out on school trips and to volunteer at special events, such as sports days, over the past couple of years. You make such a difference to us here at school and we are so very excited to be able to welcome you back again very soon. Since we last welcomed volunteers into school we have made some changes in relation to our volunteer safeguarding protocol.

This new system is now up and running and ready to be used. In the future, we will be holding a bank of volunteers for the duration of the time that their child is at the Solent Schools or for as long as they wish to volunteer. At the point of transition from Solent Infant to Solent Junior School, we will ask your permission to transfer this information over. As such, you will only need to complete the volunteer application process once. Whenever we are looking for parents and carers to support us by volunteering regularly in school, on school trips, residentials or for special events such as sports days and dance performances, we will approach those who are stored within the 'volunteer bank'. We will not be able to use anybody who is not in this 'volunteer bank' as they won't have had the necessary safeguarding checks in place. Before adding an individual to the 'volunteer bank', we will ask them to complete our volunteer process including a volunteer application form along with other safeguarding checks. This information will then be stored and retained for future use. If you would like to be added to the 'volunteer profile' within school. You will only need to do this once whilst your child(ren) attend the Solent Schools, so long as you give us permission to share your information between the infant and junior school.





This week has been a celebration of Science as we participated in British Science Week and explored the idea of "Growth". We have learned about what things grow, the conditions that they need to grow and how we can measure their growth. There have been lots of opportunities to take our learning outside into our outdoor classroom spaces—and Gardening Club made the most of their rainy afternoon to make their 'gardening expert' books and to plant some bulbs in pots. We will keep track of their growth over the next few weeks!

#### Year 2

This week, Year 2 have thoroughly enjoyed exploring 'Growth' as part of Science Week. We have become super scientists! Our experiments have included, investigating human growth, exploring living things that grow around and near trees, digging for worms and even visiting Mars! We loved creating a creature that could live on the cold, dry, red planet. It was also great fun to be able to get outside and think scientifically!



This week has been an incredibly busy one at Solent Juniors! Year 3 went off on their first residential trip. The feedback from every adult has been how well behaved the children were and how much fun was had by all. Meanwhile in school, I have been fortunate enough to be able to visit each of our classrooms to support our monitoring of teaching and learning. All of the children were eager to tell me about the skills they were learning. Every classroom was bright, exciting to be in and captured the journey the children have been on so far this term. There were examples of excellent pieces of work that the children were incredibly proud of. I was proud too when I saw how hard each and every child was working. #### Year 4

This week at the Solent Schools was Science Week. The theme for Science week was all about Growth. Each teacher focused on a different activity around the theme of Growth. The children spent an afternoon with each teacher to complete the different activities and really enjoyed spending time in different classes, to think scientifically.

#### ear 5

As part of our year 5 movement art topic, this week pupils had a go at creating their own print-making stamper using cardboard and string. They thought about a particular action they wished to focus on and then drew their design onto the cardboard. Using string, they went around the outline of their character so that it was raised from the cardboard. They then added paint to the string before transferring the stamp to paper. They thought carefully about the position of their prints and the movement sequence they wished to create.





ear 6

Over the past few weeks, year 6 have been exploring materials . We have thoroughly enjoyed the practical nature of our investigations. We have been using our Scientific vocabulary to hypothesise, plan, predict, carry out and record a range of tests. We have explored thermal insulation by responding to a plea to find out how to best keep a hot liquid hot for someone opening a coffee shop and we have also been looking at the dissolvability of different materials in water and whether or not the changes we see are reversible .

### Service Child Pebble Project 2022

The Solent Schools are taking part in the Service Child Portsmouth Pebble Project 2022. The aim is to draw eyes on a pebble to represent a Service Child in our school linked to the slogan 'Keeping an eye out for Service Children'. When complete, the pebbles will be displayed as an art installation around Portsmouth. This will lead to a CPD session in the Summer Term to help promote support fo Service Children in Portsmouth schools.

On Wednesday 16th March, Mrs Winslade took a group of Year 6 pupils to the 'Soundsational' event at Portsmouth Guildhall. The group formed part of a choir who performed alongside bands from secondary schools from around the city. This is the first time that Year 6 have been invited and we are really hoping that this is made a regular feature. Our Year 6 pupils really impressed us all with their tuneful voices, excellent mastery of the words and endless enthusiasm!

#### Junior School Playground

Earlier on this year, we shared an exciting new phase of site development involving the Solent Junior School playground. Just before the pandemic, we set about discussing how and where we might improve the play space to make it even more exciting and engaging for our pupils. Sadly, the pandemic meant that this work had to go on hold and it is only now that we have been able to resume discussions. We have now planned out the improvements for each of the areas within the playground. Below, you will find a photograph of each of the areas, along with a short description of how these will be developed.

Along the Western side of the main playground, we currently have a grassed area. This is used extensively when open. The area can only be used when the weather is fair and so is restricted to April to October when the weather is more favourable. This restricts it's use greatly. Our pupils have told us that they would like some more 'calm space' within the playground area, where they are able to sit and chat, read or take part in calm playground games. This area is therefore going to be fenced off and artificial grass laid. There will be new boards along the brick wall with storage containers for equipment for the children to use. This will mean that the play space can be used all year round!





The main playground is currently a bare concrete space with old line markings. We know that we have many pupils who are keen and interested to play a range of sports at Solent. We have therefore taken this into account and will be having one side of this space dedicated to 'court games'. There will be new netball posts, as well as goal ends and basketball goals. The court ends will have cricket stumps included within them, meaning this will truly become a multi-purpose space. The old lines will be repainted. At the other end of this space there is a section of grass with benches where the pupils like to sit and eat, read or just chat. Much like the Western end, this can only be used in fair weather. The new plans include artificially grassing over this area so that it can be used all year round.

### What Would You Like to See?

We currently have a simple and short 'trim trail' at Solent Junior School. Our pupils have told us that they find this trim trail restrictive and would like to see a far larger trim trail that challenges them and that they are able to use for ex-

tended periods of time during the school day. The current trim trail is still in good condition, so this will be kept, but extended along the Eastern side of the main playground. The new equipment will compliment what is already there but will need to add an extra dimension of challenge. We have the playground developers ready and waiting and would now like to hear what you would like to see as part of this trail. Below you will find a selection of equipment.
