Now that pupils are starting to 'scoot' into school once again, please can we remind you that pupils must not scoot once on the school site. This includes the driveway entrance at SIS and car park at SJS. If you are intending to leave a scooter on site, please also ensure that it is clearly marked with your child's name to avoid confusion. The main pedestrian entrance at SIS is always the tunnel. The driveway is predominantly for cars and should only be used by pedestrians with buggies or wheelchairs, or scooters being walked on site, rather than ridden. If you are using the driveway, please use the pavement rather than the road section of the drive as this is used by cars.

We have had a fabulous week celebrating all things Art. Linked to our recent trip to Marwell Zoo, we have been recreating a range of 'prints and patterns'. We have particularly enjoyed tearing and layering different paper to recreate the patterns of tigers, snow leopards, zebras and giraffes.

The children have been excellent at making links between their previous and current learning: we have learnt that a baby giraffe is called a calf, a baby zebra is called a foal and a baby tiger is called a cub.





What an amazing Arts Week Year One have had! We used the trip to Marwell Zoo as inspiration for some fantastic art linked to pattern and print. We have printed and drawn feathers, looked at the colours and patterns on different animals and used different skills and media, such as paint, pastels and paper, over the week to make a final 'picture' of an

animal focusing on different body parts-phew! We even managed to squeeze in some writing about Marwell and some Maths!

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We thoroughly enjoyed our trip to Marwell and saw lots of patterns and prints on many animals. This week has been Arts Week and we used the animals from the trip to inspire our art work. We made a wonderful class tile of different patterns and prints and used media of our own choice. We learnt about a South African artist called Esther Mahlangu, who is famous for her bold, large-scaled contemporary paintings that reference her Ndebele heritage. We also created our own zebra or giraffe painting and built up to the final piece over a few days.
