Phonics Update!

Why Little Wandle Revised Letters and Sounds?

As a school we carefully considered what our pupils needed from a phonics programme and what was most aligned to our beliefs and philosophy for learning. We wanted to avoid products that appeared too commercial in order to reduce cognitive load for our children. Whilst the programme is predominantly aimed at Solent Infant School pupils, we were also keen to introduce one that could extend into Key Stage 2 for any pupils who may require extended support. After a significant amount of research, including discussions with and observations in other schools, we settled on Little Wandle Revised Letters and Sounds. We felt that this programme is similar to our usual phonics teaching, reduces cognitive load for pupils and ensures a consistent approach. It also links to high quality phonics books from Collins Big Cats (already in use) . We will be providing more information on this exciting development, in September.

Next academic year, we would like to resume our parent & carer liaison meetings. As such, we are now seeking one parent or carer rep for each class to attend the meetings as a voice for that class. The meetings will be held once every half term and will be a mix of daytime / evening meetings to suit all attendees. Expectation Meetings

The principle aim of these meetings is to give parents and carers a broad introduction to the year group their child has started in, meet the class teacher and to become familiar with the classroom environment. Please note, the dates are the same for both schools, so that parents & carers are able to choose to attend both schools on the same evening. The time slots have been allocated to allow enough time to do this. Bells will sound at the beginning and end of each session.

The Autumn Term round for parents and carers to apply to join our volunteer bank is now open!

As shared in previous newsletters, we now hold a bank of volunteers. This bank is held for as long as a volunteer wishes to help within school. At the point of transfer from one school to the other, we are able to keep this information in the bank, with the permission of those volunteers. As such, you only need to complete this process once, if you wish to be added to the bank. Whenever we are looking for parents and carers to support us, by volunteering regularly in school, on school trips, residentials or for special events such as sports days and dance performances, we will approach those who are stored within the 'volunteer bank'. We will not be able to use anybody who is not in this 'volunteer bank' as they won't have had the necessary safeguarding checks in place. Before adding an individual to the 'volunteer bank', we will ask them to complete our volunteer process including a volunteer application form along with other safeguarding checks. This information will then be stored and retained for future use.
