Year 4



#Hello Yellow

On Friday 14th October we will be inviting all pupils to come into school in non school uniform wearing something yellow. This could be a full yellow suit, or an item of yellow clothing! Our aim is to make the day as big and bright as possible, so together we can show young people they're not alone with their mental health. The children will take part in a range of activities throughout the week to reinforce the fact that how they feel matters.

Throughout the month of October, the Solent Schools will be supporting the 'Portsmouth Helps Ukraine' charity. This charity regularly collects and distributes donations from their Cosham-based store. The Solent Schools will have a collection point inside the Junior School car park gate each morning throughout October. The following items are those in greatest need:

- Non-perishable food (rice, pasta, noodles, dried potato)
- Beverages (tea, coffee, hot chocolate)
- Medical supplies (bandages, tape, surgical aprons/masks/gloves etc)
- Nappies for babies
- Sleeping bags, duvets, thick blankets

Each time our donation box fills, we will fill the school minibus and drop them off with the charity in Cosham.
