o you know a Solent Young Carer!

A young carer is someone who, often from an early age, takes on regular or ongoing care and support for another family member (usually a parent or sibling) with a physical or mental illness, a disability, or who is struggling with substance misuse. Young carers often have to assume a level of responsibility that would normally only be asked of an adult.

The Solent Schools worked alongside the Portsmouth Young Carers team back in 2020 to see what additional support we could offer to our young carers. This was then halted due to Covid restrictions. We are now ready to reignite this work!

From October 2022, schools have been asked to identify how many 'young carers' they have on roll. We, at Solent, think this is a fantastic change! This is due to the fact that it is now recognised that young carers can carry immense responsibility in providing care and support at home; but their own needs may remain 'hidden' from wider view. It is intended that this identification will support schools to understand their needs and to provide early help where necessary.

We believe that we are aware of most of our young carers, due to positive home school links, however we would like to make absolutely sure we have everybody covered. 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

Year 4


