These 2 classes will be receiving £10 to spend on something nice for their classrooms. The class can choose to spend or save each time they win!





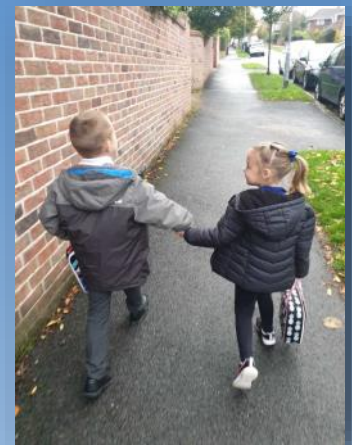
SOLENT INFANT SCHOOL

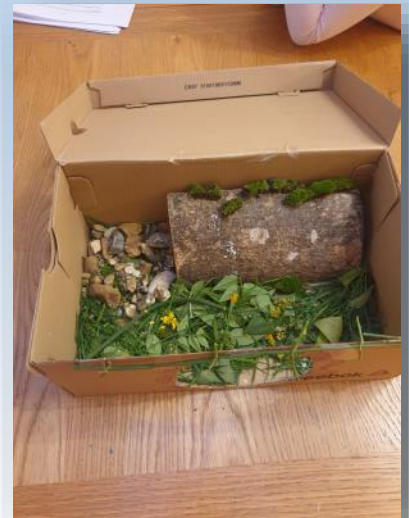
Year 1

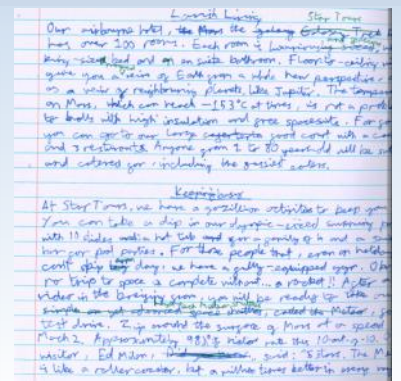
Year 4

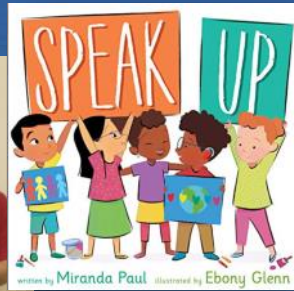
