





Year 4

Last week, Year 4 became amazing poets and have shown off all of what they have discovered about the different styles of poetry. Year 4 have created their own poems, drawing upon the structure of a range of poetic forms, about 'a journey of...'. We have been amazed at how effectively Year 4 have applied various poetic devices to their work, and also the imagination shown . We have seen examples of a journey of a lead, an abandoned shoe, and an item of food as it travels through the digestive system. Well done Year 4!

This week in Year 4, we have introduced our new topic of Imaginary Settings in English. The children have loved reading and discussing existing imaginary setting texts from a range of authors including The lion, the witch and the wardrobe by C.S Lewis, The Lord of the Rings by J.R.R Tolkien and Peter Pan by J.M Barrie. The children then had the chance to get creative, planning and writing their very own setting description of Neverland, complete with a beautifully hand drawn map.



Year 5

Last week, the children were introduced to their new topic unit focusing on the Anglo Saxons and Vikings. We discussed their prior knowledge and they shared what they would like to find out throughout their learning journey. To support this, we have been focusing on the book 'Viking Boy' by Tony Bradman in Guided Reading. We have explored some of the vocabulary within the text, whilst using our comprehension and inference skills to build our understanding.





This week year 6 have been delving in to the world of Materials and their Properties. We have explored lots of 'what if' style questions based on the world around us and how materials are chosen for specific purposes because their properties closely match requirements. To further embed our learning. We are applying what we know to planning and carrying out a fair test to see how best to keep a warm fluid warm. Our options include adding a lid, wrapping the cup in different materials and trying cups made of different materials.
