This week, the children of Year 1 have worked hard to understand and locate the polar regions and the equator. The children have learnt about the Arctic and Antarctic. In English, the children have drafted postcards to the Pilchard-Browns (the penguin family from our class story 'Poles Apart') inviting them to visit Portsmouth and its wonderful attractions. In Maths, the children have learnt about length and height. They understand that there are different ways to record measure.
