


Year I

Safety on our School Roads

This week, we have received a high number of calls and emails from people concerned about the number of parents and carers who are driving to school and parking irresponsibly making our school roads highly unsafe for our pupils and their families. Following these complaints, we contacted the parking enforcement team at PCC. Explained our woes and also about all the complaints, the dangerous parking on double yellows, reversing out into Farlington Avenue, parking over residents driveways and further concerns. They have informed us that they are going to put it out on a job sheet and ask for a parking enforcement officer to come out over a few days and patrol up and down, reminding parents/carers about good considerate parking and road use generally. This will be both at the beginning and end of the day.

If you are concerned about the way in which our community is using the roads around school, our advice would always be to contact the parking enforcement team at PCC yourselves. As a school, we are incredibly restricted as to what we are allowed to enforce and reporting these concerns really does support us and help to keep our children safe!
