









SOLENT INFANT SCHOOL

Keeping Solent Safe!

Every wondered why you might be given a red lanyard when you visit the Solent Schools and others have Blue or Green? This is because we have colour coded lanyards at the Solent Schools. Each represents how 'safe' an adult in school is. Ask your children and see if they can tell you what each of our lanyards mean. Below you will find the colour key! Only those will safeguarding clearance can be unaccompanied whilst on site.



Green are worn by volunteers who have full safeguarding clearance from school.

Blue badges are worn by all staff at the Solent Schools. All adults have full safeguarding checks in place.



Red badges are worn by visitors for whom we do not have full safeguarding clearance. They must be accompanied by a staff member at all times whilst on site.

Black are worn by Governors, who also have full safeguarding clearance.
