This term our topic is Marvellous Me! We have been focusing on our bodies, how they work and how to keep them healthy. We have talked about the bones in our bodies and what we need to stay alive. The children have also really enjoyed looking carefully at their facial features and trying hard to draw half of their face. With the warmer weather, Reception have been able to enjoy more time spent on their balconies. We have been practising our personal, social and emotional skills by turn taking, role playing and being imaginative with others.

Year 1 have been enjoying their final half term! The half term started with a 'hook' for our English book, 'Message in a Bottle'. We have also been learning all about fractions in maths and have found halves and quarters of shapes and quantities.





Our theme for this half term is 'Here comes the Sun'. In English we have started to write leaflets advertising Lion's paradise island from our book 'A message in a Bottle'. In History, we have been learning about the Victorian seaside and comparing it to seaside holidays today. We had great fun exploring a Victorian suitcase and dressing up in Victorian outfits! We thought that the swimming costume was very funny and not very easy to swim in!

Wow! Last week, Year 1 ventured on two trips. One trip to Queen Elizabeth Country Park and another to St Andrews Church. The children had a great time at the church and met Reverend Gully. Reverend Gully discussed baptism and how special water is. Some children were even chosen to act out a christening. The children were enthralled and came away from the church saying how great it was. The Year 1 children should be very proud of how they represented Solent Infant School.





This week, Year 1 have taken part in lots of transition activities. The children have met their new Year 2 teachers and have had a chance to explore their new classrooms. They have had joined in with a Year 2 PE, Music and Computing lesson. Linked to the story of 'The Rainbow Fish', the children have thought about friendship and sharing, and discussed making new friends in their new classes. They made some lovely colourful rainbow fish of their own!

Year 2 are having a fantastic final half term! They enjoyed their 'Buddy Visit' to the Junior School and made sure they all looked super smart for the school photo. In Science, the children completed their longitudinal study into minibeasts in the school grounds and found that there seemed to be far more in the summer, than the winter. Mrs Lempriere was especially proud of the speakers at the English Workshop! The children involved confidently explained why they love reading and writing and were so confident speaking in front of the audience!





Year 2 have enjoyed their writing about Twisted Tales. We looked at the story of The Three Little Wolves and The Big Bad Pig and used all of our super Literacy Skills to make predictions, discuss our favourite vocabulary and sequence the events in the story. We then wrote a retell of our own version of the story by changing the characters to our favourite Predator and Prey. The school adults have been really impressed with the super use of vocabulary and careful story map planning. Well done, Year 2!

In Science, we learnt about food chains in preparation for our trip to Queen Elizabeth Country Park (QECP). We were amazed to learn that not all predators and carnivores must be large like a wolf. At QECP, we continued our food chain learning with a hunt for minibeasts. We identified and named many different creatures. We compared what we found at QECP with the creatures that we found in our own school orchard and discussed why there were differences. We had a wonderful time!





Year 2 have had the most amazing week! On Monday and Tuesday we went to the Juniors and spent the day with our new Year 3 teachers which was great fun and so exciting. On Thursday and Friday all our hard work learning the songs, our lines and rehearsing on the stage came to an end when we performed our 'show' end of year show Superkids to our parents and grandparents. We looked fabulous in our costumes with jazzy hair and face paints and our teachers were super proud of us and how well we performed.





Year 5

The children were each given a picture book and read the story together and then recreated an illustration from the book. Previously, we visited the Year 2's at the Infant school for an outdoor scavenger hunt. It has been lovely seeing the children getting to know each other as our future Year 6's support the current Year 2's transition into Year 3. Last week, we welcomed the Year 2's back for their final buddy visit before September.

Last Friday, Year 5 immersed themselves in a fun-filled DT day! They will be researched designed, made and tested/ evaluated their very own parachutes. This supports our current Science learning exploring forces! We explored the forces acting on our parachutes and considered the appropriate materials to use to make them successful! We cant wait to update you with how we got on!







Year 5 have been recently studying life in two contrasting cities in the world. Beginning by looking at their home town of Portsmouth and then the city of Lima in Peru; contrasting the Geography and populations between the two. To support the understanding of these two contrasting cities and their cultures, the year group have been reading 'Journey to Jo'berg' by Beverley Naidoo and studying 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty. These texts highlight the difficulties of life in parts of the world or cities that have high levels of poverty.

Before half term, we started to explore an exciting enterprise opportunity called 'Virgin Money: Make £5 grow'. Year 6 have looked into budgeting, teamwork and enterprise skills to help them with their planning. They have come up with their own ideas of what they want from their business and to make sure it stands out from others. Everyone has shown all our schools values and we can't wait to have the opportunity to sell the product/service to the rest of the school. We would love to see as many of you there as possible! Over the last week, year 6 have ventured into non-chronological report writing they have been researching and creating Earthquake survival guides. Pupils have been using images, videos, news reports and eye witness recounts to generate language linked to being caught in an Earthquake, and used these to create leaflets of their own design. The children were all given the opportunity to use their own way of planning. So far the outcomes are very impressive!





The last week has seen many of our year 6 pupils visit their future senior schools as part of their transition activities. Having completed some pretransition activities around moving, on, fears, excitement and questions, the pupils have all come back from their respective schools, buzzing with excitement for their future. Activities includ-

ed using the Science labs, DT - making key rings and cookery. Safe to say the pupils all now feel ready to move up - its just the small matter of the final two weeks to go to get survive!
