
Summer Fayre

Y5 trip to Springfield secondary school

On Tuesday the Eleventh of July, Year 5 went to Springfield Secondary School for a taster morning and a chance to experience what a Secondary School will be like. There was a carousel of activities; science, food technology and design technology. First, we gathered in the tennis courts, where we were greeted by Mrs Goldsmith (who is in charge of transition from Primary to Secondary School). She guided us to our starting sessions, we were also helped by the tutor group assistants (TGA's). One of the sessions was Science, which was led by one of the expert Science teachers. Our experiment was called the royal mix up, where we tested some substances for : flour; we tested this by adding a liquid called iodine if the substance turned black/blue. We also tested bicarbonate soda by adding vinegar to see if it would fizz. The last ingredient that we tested for was sugar by applying Benedicts solution and warm water to see if it turned yellow, green or brick red.

One of the other lessons was Food technology, where we baked Palmiers, which are pastries covered in cinnamon sugar. We had to mould, the pastries into whatever shapes we would like and then sprinkle them in cinnamon sugar. Then we had to place them in to the oven for around ten minutes. When we took them out of the oven, we rapped them into tin foil and chose if we wanted to eat them or not.

The final lesson was Design technology, where we made keyrings. We started by using wet and dry paper to smooth over the sides of the acrylic, further allowing us to peel off the protective film. Next we painted the acrylic, which when we whipped it down it revealed a beautiful pattern. Finally we added a split ring, which finished off our keyrings.

We think EVERYONE really enjoyed their time at Springfield school!

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
SUPERSTAN
