## Summer Reading Challenge 2023!

### Summer Reading Challenge 2023



Presented by The Reading Agency. Delivered in partnership with libraries.

The Summer Reading Challenge 2023 starts on Saturday 8 July and runs until Saturday 23 September. The challenge encourages children aged 4 to 11 to read up to six library books during the long summer holiday.



How it works:

Children register for the challenge in their local library. Whichever library they sign up in is the one they need to continue using during the challenge

Children decide how many books they would like to read for the challenge. We recommend six but children can read more or less than this

Children can read whatever they like – fiction, fact books, poetry, joke books, picture books, audio books, eBooks – just as long as they are borrowed from the library

Children receive special rewards each time they finish a book and there's a certificate and medal for everyone who completes the challenge

This year the Winner's Event is on Sunday 24 September at Southsea Castle. If you can't make this event, don't worry – children can still collect their medal and certificate from the library they registered to do the challenge in

The Summer Reading Challenge is open to all primary school aged children and is designed for all reading abilities. Children can sign up for free at all Portsmouth libraries during the summer holidays

Throughout the challenge, library staff and volunteers support children, helping them to explore a wide range of different types of books and enjoy a range of creative activities and events.

It's also possible to register to do the challenge online. This challenge runs separately to the one run in libraries so the rewards and incentives are all digital. However children who complete the challenge online are still welcome to attend the Winners Event. We will email all online completers in September to send them an invite, only if you click the option to allow data to be shared with us when enrolling your child in the online challenge.
