Year 2 have had great fun in Engineering Fairy Tales Week, focusing on the story of Rapunzel. We used our designing, making and evaluation skills to make a 'Contraption' to help her escape from the tower. We made ladders, hot air balloons, zip wires, parachutes and planes. We are so proud of all of the children and the perseverance and teamwork skills that they have demonstrated.

We have all launched into our learning, after the Easter Holidays, with our Engineering Fairy Tales Week. Familiar stories have been explored and tricky challenges have been investigated! Year R have built chairs for Goldilocks and the Three Bears, Year 1 have helped the Three Billy Goats Gruff cross the river and Year 2 have helped Rapunzel escape from her tower.
