Easing Restrictions Around School

It has always been lovely to be able to mix 3 classes of pupils at certain points, enabling really strong friendship bonds to develop across a wider range of pupils. In some cases at the junior school, given the current site restrictions, rejoining year groups had meant shorter playtimes. We are very aware of this and are tweaking timetables to ensure that pupils get to spend as much time in the fresh air as possible! It will not be long before we are able to consider further integration beyond the classroom. Another fantastic piece of news, that we have received over the weekend, is that we are now also able to sing in class groups! We are all really looking forward to the uplifting sound of song filling our corridors once again!

As restrictions ease, some of our after school clubs are beginning to reopen. These are those that are run by external providers, who hire out our premises from which to run their clubs. As they do reopen, they will be added to the website under the 'School Life—After School Provision' tab.

Site Development

As you pass Solent Junior School, it is hard to miss the scaffolding that wraps around almost the entire building! This is due to the fact that the majority of the roof (parts of which are over 100 years old) is being replaced. This work is being funded by a successful Condition Improvement bid and is due to be finished later on this summer. In addition to this work, plans are well under way to convert the old office space and a vacant corridor space into four brand new intervention and pastoral care spaces. The refurbishment will also include offices with work stations for our teaching and learning staff. We are very excited about this next step and look forward to sharing the development with you once it is completed over the summer holidays!

This week, we celebrated National Numeracy Day and talked about how important it is to understand and use numbers in our every-day lives. The children in all year groups participated in number challenges and used their reasoning skills and mathematical language to explain their understanding. Despite the changeable weather, we have been trying to make the most of the outdoor learning spaces wherever possible. Year R have been using resources in the outdoors to explore symmetry, placing natural objects on butterfly wings to produce patterns. They battled against the elements to stop the patterns from flying away but they were proud of the results!


