New Class Updates—Transition

Following on from the very successful open events for our new year R and 3 pupils we are now running a number of other transition activities to support our pupils across the Solent Schools. Our Year 2 pupils have been submitting questions to their Year 5 buddies to answer using live Teams sessions between the Year 2 and Year 5 classes. If restrictions ease, there will also be an opportunity for our new Year 3 pupils (current Year 2 pupils) to meet their new Year 6 (current Year 5) buddies. All of our teachers have now engaged in transition talks, enabling current class teachers to share information about all of their pupils with their new class teachers. There will also be 'This is Me' introduction pieces from both teachers and LSAs for their new classes. These will support pupils in getting to know their new class adults a little better and will be going live in brand new class teams pages on Friday 16th July. Videos from the class teachers for their new pupils will also be going live on Friday 16th July. Pupils have been engaging in a range of further activities within school to support them with the transition to new classes including circle times, small group work with our ELSAs to discuss changes and how they make us feel and spending a little time outdoors in the orchard with their new class peers. They then played games and introduced themselves to one another. Year 2 have even made a book for their new class teacher as a surprise for the junior teachers! Our Year 6 pupils have been taking part in 'No Fears' activities to prepare them for their move to senior school and Springfield staff have been into the junior school to talk to the Year 6 pupils, answering any questions that they may have.



Mrs Witt has had the most amazing time seeing all our lovely junior school Armed Forces children this week. She thinks they have been surprised to see how many other children, just in their year group, are all part of the Armed Forces community. They shared their own experiences and had some fun too!


