The Solent Schools would like to say a huge thank you to everybody who has been involved in supporting the Friends of the Solent Schools (FSS). In July 2021 the FSS organised a truly fantastic 80s Danceathon day. This event alone raised a staggering £2450.80! This figure will increase yet further once the 'Gift Aid' is added.

The Grand Summer Raffle raised a total of £515, again this is without 'Gift Aid' added yet!

The Fantastic FSS raised a grand total of £3700 for our schools in 2020-2021, even with Covid restrictions in place!
